The Fund is a sub-fund of AMG Funds plc (the "Company")

Objectives and Investment Policy

The Fund aims to provide you with a return greater than that of the MSCI World Small Cap Net Index.

The Fund will seek to achieve its objective by investing directly and/or indirectly (i.e. through derivative contracts and collective investment schemes) in equities and/or equity related securities of, or relating to, small capitalisation companies located in developed markets and emerging markets (the latter being subject to a maximum of 30% of the Fund's assets) across all industry sectors.

The equity related securities in which the Fund may invest include common shares, preferred shares, REITs (a type of pooled investment vehicle which invests in real property or real property related loans or interests), depository receipts, warrants and securities that are convertible into common shares, preferred shares and depository receipts.

The Fund may invest up to 10% of its assets in each of bonds and collective investment schemes in order to gain exposure to equities. Bonds may be convertible bonds (which may embed a derivative) or fixed or floating rate corporate bonds. Convertible bonds are bonds which may be converted into common stock.

The Fund may use financial derivative instruments for both hedging and investment purposes, specifically options and futures, to a limited extent. Options are contracts where the buyer has the right, but not the obligation, to buy or sell another security at a specific price on or before a specified future date. Futures are contracts, traded on an exchange, that create an obligation to buy or sell another security on or before a specified future date.

The Fund may also, pending reinvestment, or if this is considered appropriate to the investment objective (for example due to market turmoil) invest up to 10% of its assets on a short term basis in cash and cash equivalents.

You may sell your shares any day (except Saturday or Sunday) that commercial banks and foreign exchange markets are open and settle payments in Dublin.

The Fund does not declare a dividend and therefore your shares do not pay you income.

Recommendation: this fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within 3 years.

Market Risk – The value of the Fund's assets can be affected by daily stock market movement and some markets may become illiquid or highly volatile. Other influential factors include political, economic news, company earnings and significant corporate events.

Small Companies Risk – shares in smaller companies are often more volatile and less liquid than stocks of larger, more established companies.

Credit and Counterparty Risk – there is a risk that the issuer of debt securities or a counterparty to a derivatives contract may not be able to meet interest, principal or settlement payments or otherwise honour its obligations. Similarly, the insolvency of any institutions providing services such as safekeeping of assets may expose the Fund to financial loss.

Currency Risk – the Fund may invest in securities that are issued in currencies other than the base currency of the Fund.

Liquidity Risk – there is a risk that adverse market conditions may affect the Fund's ability to sell assets at the price the Fund would like, or the Fund may have to sell them at a loss.

Emerging Markets Risk – the Fund may invest in emerging markets which carry higher than average investment risks and the Fund may have problems or delays in having its investments returned when required.

Derivatives Risk – the complexity and rapidly changing structure of derivatives markets may increase the possibility of market losses.

Charges

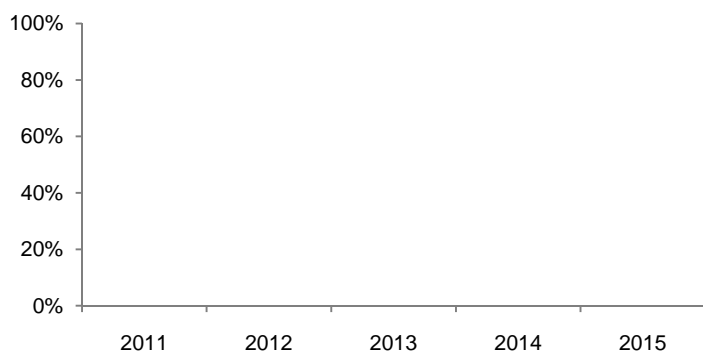

For a period of 12 months from the launch of the Fund, the Investment Manager will bear all fees and expenses associated with the Fund (other than its fees) which are above 0.20% of the Net Asset Value of the relevant share class.

It is possible to exchange your shares in the Fund for shares in other sub-funds of the Company. Details on exchanges of shares are provided in the prospectus. An entry charge may apply.
